Workshop fees

A base registration fee of \$150 will include the workshop, coffee breaks, lunches and ice-breaker. Participants can choose to add up accommodation (\$50, a double shared-room hostel with breakfast), excursion/dinner (\$50) or both.

The workshop is limited to 50 participants. Participants will be selected based on the quality of the submitted abstract (250 words max.), the relevance of their research and a short statement of motivation as to why the participant wants to attend.

A limited number of grants will be available to support ECRs for costs including registration and/or travel, especially those from low-GDP per Capita countries. The maximum amount of support is \$750. Grants will be transferred after the conference, after submission of completed reimbursement forms (to be handed out at conference) and receipts of costs.

* defined as early-career researchers who obtained or expect to receive their PhD in or after 2011. The nine years since PhD include adjustment for career breaks (e.g. maternity/ paternity leaves, illness, sabbaticals).
